

Me: Alright, now that you've had a chance to work with my program, I think it's time that we discuss a little bit about the functionality of it. So first of all, when you launched the program, the Main Page should open to three buttons: "Schedule," "Calendar," and "Template." Did this happen as intended?

Client: Yes, the Main Page generated as it was supposed to. It was very clean and well organized but I think that a bit more color would improve the look. It does have a clean, modern appearance but the grey throughout can be a bit drab.

Me: Okay. Then, under "Schedule," you have a 4x5 grid of buttons corresponding to the lesson schedule at your school. Was this helpful?

Client: Oh, yes, I saw the format right away. It looked very intuitive and personally adaptable to my schedule.

Me: Great. Now whenever any of the schedule buttons are clicked, the Planner Page should appear with text fields that can be edited and three buttons: "Save," "Clear," and "Load." Any ideas about this?

Client: It did exactly what I wanted. I enjoyed how everything was so organized. I also enjoyed seeing the lesson plan details that we had discussed in the first consultation. Something that would have been an improvement I noticed was the option to add hyperlinks. I have a lot of online resources so this would be easy and convenient to access.

Me: Thanks, that's a good idea. Now, did the save button properly save your lesson plans as .txt files?

Client: Yes, they were saved in the project directory. The confirmation message was also helpful in letting me know that it was saved and made the program feel responsive.

Me: Did auto-load work when reopening a lesson plan?

Client: Yes, that's correct. Saved plans were automatically pasted on opening the page, so that was fine.

Me: And what about the Load feature? Was it working to load the saved templates via a File Chooser?

Client: Yes, the File Chooser did list the files in the templates directory, and selecting a plan loaded the content with no problem. It was very straightforward and easy to use.

Me: And the Clear function? Did it clear the text fields and associated file okay?

Client: Yes, just what I would have expected - and I liked the confirmation panel before clearing, to prevent accidental erasure.

Me: Did the Templates page come up OK?

Client: Yes, but wasn't immediately sure what "File Name" was. Once I realized, it was okay, but a note or a revision to the labelling might help new users.

Me: OK, do you have any other feedback regarding the template function?

Client: I think it would be helpful to perhaps develop a means of previewing all of the templates to see what I have saved without needing to press the load button.

Me: Great idea, thank you. To the Calendar then, did everything work okay here?

Client: Yes, that was working fine and very easy to use.

Me: Last of all, when you clicked on a date in the Calendar, would you then be taken to the relevant Planner Page if you clicked on a period?

Client: Yes, though I was struggling to remember where I had saved my plan. When there are so many possibilities for days, months, years, it is easy for it to get tricky to navigate through with ease. Maybe some customisable colour option could assist here to mark out days where plans are saved.

Me: Oh yes that's a great idea, Thank you! Do you have any other comments on further development?

Client: Other than what I suggested - a hyperlink feature, template preview, a colour selection - I think the basic function works well.

Me: Thanks for your time. I'll try to include these and create an even better program.
